## ONLINE SAFETY – Here is this week’s Top Tip – It’s Good To Talk

Talk to your children about why it is important to stay safe online. It is important to be clear that you are not saying your child may never use the internet again, or that everything on it is harmful – it is about teaching them to have a greater awareness and to be able to manage and report any risks.
